




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

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

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Person of Interest

Tinashe Nyamukoda

Tinashe is the brains behind Kumusha Wines. They are winery based in Slanghoek, Western Cape, South Africa. The company started with releasing a white blend, Kumusha White, at the end of 2017. The fruit in the blend comes from a 37 year old Chenin Blanc and 19 year old Semillon vineyard. After the white wine's success, Kumusha went on to launch a red wine, a Cabernet Sauvignon/Cinsaut blend, as its winter release in 2018. Kumusha Wines currently exports to Belgium and the Netherlands and is also looking to export to the US, UK, and Zimbabwe in the near future. The wine is also a major hit in Durban, South Africa. Kumusha Wines has received overwhelming support for its authentic flavours.

Tinashe Nyamukoda arrived in South Africa in 2008 with no job prospects and no knowledge of wine. After a 3 month stint at a bakery, Tinashe was offered an opportunity to work at Roundhouse Restaurant, Cape Town. There he enrolled in

a hospitality and wine program that marked the start of his career as a sommelier. Nyamukoda later worked at the Showroom Restaurant before going to the One and Only Hotel where he worked with well established sommeliers. Nvamukoda has a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting Science but passion moved him towards all things wine, culminating in his enrollment in the Cape Town Wine Academy. There he attained African Wine and Certificate Wine courses and later, Wines of the World and Wine and Food courses. Nyamukoda is now the head sommelier and beverage manager at The Test Kitchen Restaurant in Cape Town. Today, Tinashe is hailed as one of the most respected sommeliers of the continent, tasting on the Michelangelo Wine and Spirits awards, the Chenin Blanc Top 10 Challenge and Platter Awards Five Star panel. He is a board member of the South African Sommelier Association as well as the BLACC (Black Cellar Club) and has represented Zimbabwe at the World Blind Tasting Championships in 2017 and 2018

My 'Kumusha' Philosophy

Kumusha is a Shona word which means 'your home', 'your roots' and 'your origin'. I believe the best wines are representative of their region. I met Attie Louw from Opstal Estate some years ago and our relationship has grown. As a result I have been able to work with the fruit from the Breedekloof Valley to create wines that I would not only

like to drink and are representative of what is leading the way for the style of South African wines. Minimal intervention wine making and natural fermentation is aimed at letting the wine be free to do the talking of its origin. I am not

This is in line with his vision to work with people who not only believe in his brand but also the service industry as a whole. Tree of the Month

Chocolate-berry

Family: Lamiaceae (previously Verbenaceae)

Ndebele: Umtswankela Shona: Mudyagava

The genus Vitex was named by Linnaeus in his book "Species Plantarum", published in 1753. It comes from the name used by Pliny the Elder for Vitex agnus-castus, derived from the Latin "vieo" meaning "to weave", a reference to the fact that Vitex agnus-castus was used in basket weaving.

The Lamiaceae family is well known as it a mostly herbaceous group that contains many fragrant species used in perfumery or in cooking like lavender, mint, spearmint, peppermint, marjoram, basil, sage, rosemary and thyme. The Vitex group was initially included in Verbenaceae but DNA studies showed that they were Lamiaceae. Vitex are nevertheless different from other Lamiaceae as they have palmate leaves. Nine Vitex species are represented in Zimbabwe but only Vitex payos has a broad geographic distribution.

Vitex payos is a small to medium-sized tree 4-10 m high, with a rounded crown. It occurs in open woodland and on rocky outcrops and on termite mounds at medium to low altitudes, with a preference for the drier areas. The bark is grey to brown, deeply striated longitudinally, peeling

in strips; growing tips and new stems and leaves with tawny woolly hairs. With age the branches become hairless, with prominent leaf-scars.

The leaves are normally 5-foliolate but quite often only 3- or 4-foliolate when the smaller basal pair have not developed. The leaflets are obovate, ranging in size from 3 to 19 cm by 1.5 to 9 cm, the top leaflet being the biggest and the two basal ones being the smallest. They are bright green and hairy on top and very light green and very hairy on the back. The net veining is prominent on both sides and the upper third of the leaflets can be toothed. The petioles are long, 6 to 15 cm, covered with short tawny hair.


The flowers grow in axillary heads and are blue, mauve to white, weakly two-lipped. The fruit is fleshy, black when ripe and edible. Recent research has shown that it contains vitamin C. Kimondo et al. (2012) state that the fruit pulp contains three water-soluble vitamins: C (ascorbic acid), B3 (niacin) and B6 (pyridoxine). Moreover, the fruit pulp could provide potassium in large quantities while it is a source of other macronutrients such as magnesium, sodium, phosphorus and calcium in smaller quantities. The pulp contains micronutrients such as iron, manganese and zinc.

Use

In the North-Eastern region of Kenya the tree is cultivated for its fruit. The wood of Vitex payos although not durable has occasionally been used to make some items of furniture but its scattered distribution limits its usefulness. Medicinally the smoke of the burned leaves is inhaled against coughs. A porridge made with the roots is used in the treatment of gonorrhoea and also to prevent abortion.

Festive Season Plants

Christmas is a time for beauty and good cheer and nothing ushers in beauty and good cheer like beautiful flowers and plants for Christmas. You might like a few of these traditional Christmas plants and flowers for your home this holiday.

Christmas Cactus (Schlumbergera bridgessi) is an attractive and popular house plant. The name originates from the fact that they used to bloom naturally at Christmas. These lovely cacti have lush flowers that hang down like lovely Christmas ornaments from the ends of the leaves of the plant. They are also easy to propagate and you can just cut a short Y shaped piece from the stem tips and place this in sandy soil and water and it should root easily.

Rosemary (Rosmarinus officinalis) translates to "mist of the sea," as its grey-green foliage is thought to resemble mist against the sea cliffs of the Mediterranean, where the plant originates. It is not a well known Christmas plant but originates from part of the Nativity story where apparently Baby Jesus' clothes were dried on a Rosemary bush. It was then believed that smelling Rosemary at Christmas brought good luck. Today, in Europe, Rosemary is sold as a Christmas plant pruned in the form of a Christmas tree. It is also attractive to bees.

Lavender (Lavandula) is not really associated with Christmas but is a lovely new tradition that is springing up mainly in Europe and America. The normally scraggly bushes are pruned and pinched until they resemble a small Christmas Tree. As long as they are kept trimmed they can give you years of fun on the table and add a nice aroma to the room too.

Holly (*Ilex aquifolium*) wasn't always easily available here but with the importation of European grown plants is now seen in our nurseries. Remember that only the female bush has the red berries and that you need a male bush around for pollination. Good luck with trying to figure out the sex without the berries!

Its origins are meant to date back to the Druids, who thought the plant represented everlasting life. Christians adopted the plant as a symbol of Jesus' promise of everlasting life.

Mistletoe (Viscum album) is another holiday tradition plant also dating back to the Druids. But, unlike holly, the Christian church did not accept it as a tradition, but rather frowned on it. It was even banned at one point in the Christian Church. However as you know it is still commonly seen. Apparently it was originally a sign of fertility, but is now simply an excuse to grab a kiss from someone dear to you. There is a lovely line in one old movie where the boy has no mistletoe but says "I have broccoli instead" so maybe hang up the broccoli and see what happens!

The Christmas Tree is traditionally an Evergreen Fir originally used to celebrate all winter festivals (both pagan and Christian) for thousands of years. Branches were used to decorate the home during winter as it reminded

people of the spring to come. Romans used Fir trees to decorate their temples and Christians use it as a sign of everlasting life with God. There is no reliable record of when Fir trees were first used as Christmas trees. It probably began about 1000 years ago in Northern Europe when Christmas Trees seem to have been hung upside down from the ceiling.

Discover Harare

Harare's Cathedrals

Have you ever wondered why our city looks the way it does? Could there be hidden stories behind these structures that help us understand who we are today? Recently, developers, administrators and architects have initiated a fascinating and creative dialogue regarding the best of the old and new Harare. Their efforts reveal an intrinsic need to preserve buildings and spaces in the city based on symbolic, sentimental, historical and entertainment value.

The Historic Buildings Advisory Committee to the National Museums and Monuments has a special criterion to select these buildings. It includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- The building must have outstanding representation of a particular architectural style.
- The building is eccentric, original, incorporates unusual materials, or is the only remaining example of its kind.
- It contributes to the environment, and historical associations with either people or events.

Such buildings include the Catholic Cathedral (Simon Vengayi Muzenda Av and Herbert Chitepo Street) and the Anglican Cathedral (Nelson Mandela Street and Sam Nujoma Street).

The Catholic Cathedral of the Sacred Heart was built by French and German brothers with

the assistance of African tradesman instead of Europeans tradesman, unusual for the 1950s. It stands in Gothic style, the last echo of medieval world of craft. Most of the work was carried out in Chishawasha (2 days away by ox-wagon at that time, now a mere 30- minute drive). The construction took 18 months to complete. The architect, Father Le Boenf created other notable works that include the St Georges College, Dominican Convent among other mission churches.

The Cathedral of Saint Mary and All Saints was built in the Romanesque style between 1913-1964. It has many outstanding features including the original cross in St George's Chapel made of cigar boxes, carved altar rail, high granite arches, and beautiful cloisters.

It is essential to foster appreciation of our surrounding structures and how they affect our lives in a broader cultural and social context. Whether a local or a tourist, the curious can experience a fun and rewarding process of exploration and discovery of secrets of Harare.

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

What is the Goldilocks Zone?

On an Earth teeming with life, we may wonder whether there is life elsewhere in the Universe vet an answer of either "Yes" or "No" would be profoundly scary. From our limited experience, we are pretty sure that most biochemical reactions, and thus any form of life, would need liquid water to evolve and flourish. Therefore if we were to look for extraterrestrial life, we should be looking in places where we could reasonably expect to find liquid water. For any planet to host life, its surface would have to be "not too hot, not too cold," but, like Baby Bear's porridge, "Just Right!" The area of space around each star which receives the right amount of heat to melt ice without vaporising it into steam, is known to astronomers as *The Goldilocks Zone*.


Within our Solar System, Venus, Earth and Mars all exist within the Goldilocks Zone. Venus however, has an atmosphere much denser than ours and full of Greenhouse gases like CO2 which have raised the surface temperature to a point hot enough to melt lead. Recent exploration on Mars shows that the planet must once have had rivers and oceans. Even though Mars has long

since lost most of its atmosphere and is now very much cooler, there do seem to be surface flows of water from time to time and Mars remains an interesting candidate for the discovery of extraterrestrial life, or more likely, fossilized remains.

We know that other stars also have planets within their Goldilocks Zones. A red dwarf star called Trappist 1, 49 light years distant, is orbited by at least seven planets, of which three lie within that star's Goldilocks Zone and, if they have the right atmospheric conditions, should contain liquid water and maybe even life.

The Astronomy Society of Harare has a presentation at 5:45pm on the second Wednesday of every month (except for December) at the Lecture Theatre at St. George's College and you're all invited to come along. Matamba Fruit Glazed Gammon

Mike was born in Harare and trained as a chef at the Aarhus Teknisk Intitute in Aarhus Denmark. He worked at Michelin star II Cantuccio in Albavilla, Milano, Italy. He recently returned and works for Pure Africa and Zambezi House Victoria Falls.

Treat family and friends to his Zimbabwean flavour Gammon Ham this Christmas. It features the wild Matamba fruit as the glaze and your loved ones will not be disappointed. Matamba (monkey orange) is a round fruit the size of a large orange. It grows in both tropical and sub-tropical Africa. It is a rock-hard green fruit that ripens into yellow. Inside there are seeds covered in gooey, gelatinous sweet and tangy pulp.

Recipe (Serves 4-6)

INGREDIENTS:

1kg uncooked gammon ham 1 medium onion 3 bay leaves

2 tbsp vinegar

40 cloves

Matamba and Orange glaze:

5 matamba 300 ml orange juice 3 tbsp mustard 100g dark sugar

METHOD:

- 1. Place your ham in a pot and cover with water.
- 2. Add the onion bay leaves and vinegar.
- 3. Bring to a slight boil for 45 minutes and remove and cool(you can do this the day before you have your family lunch to avoid less stress).
- 4. While waiting for the ham to cool get on with the glaze.
- 5. Crack open your matamba and add the insides pips and all to a pot. Add the orange then bring to a boil. Whisk to get all flesh off the matamba. After 5 minutes sieve the liquid into a bowl and discard the pips!



and sugar and heat till sugar is dissolved- you should be left with a thick paste.

Damba (singular) Matamba (plural)

7. Remove the skin from the ham by putting your finger under the skin then work your way under till you can pull it off be careful not to remove the fat layer.

- 8. Take a small knife and score the fat at 2cm intervals going one way the the other to get a criss cross effect, then push your cloves in the diamond shapes.
- 9. Add some glaze.
- 10. Set in an oven tray and fill with water just till the bottom is covered- this prevents burning add adds a moisture effect in the oven!
- 11. Baste with matamba and orange every 20 minutes for 1hr 30 minutes then take out and let rest for 15 minutes before cutting.

Serve with Chef Rumbie's Potato Salad, with red onion, leeks and crispy bacon.

Gourmet Potato Salad

Whether it's with friends or family, Christmas is always more meaningful when it's shared. Often we are stuck in the kitchen doing all the meal preparation on the day and we don't have enough time to catch up with our loved ones. Try this delicious recipe that can be made the day before and is a great accompaniment to Chef Mike's gammon.

INGREDIENTS:

½ cup deep fried bacon (cut up into bite size) 8 large potatoes (peeled and cubed) 3 leeks (thinly sliced diagonally-garnish) ½ teaspoon mixed herbs ½ teaspoon freshly cracked peppercorns

Dressing:

½ cup plain Greek yoghurt 1½ cup mayonnaise ½ teaspoon mustard

Caramelised onion:

1 finely chopped red onion ½ a cup balsamic vinegar 1 tablespoon brown sugar ½ teaspoon salt ½ teaspoon black pepper

METHOD:

1. Boil the potatoes in lightly salted water until

they are fully cooked but still have their form.

- 2. Place in a colander and toss around to drain water and fluff them out.
- 3. Allow to cool and place in a bowl, not the display bowl because this it can be pretty messy.
- 4. In a saucepan, add 1 finely chopped red onion, ½ a cup balsamic vinegar, 1 tablespoon brown sugar, ½ teaspoon salt

and ½ teaspoon black pepper.

- 5. Cook over medium heat until the sugar caramelizes and the onions are sticky but still have moisture. Cool, jar, refrigerate and use when necessary.
- 6. Into the bowl add mixed herbs, black peppercorns, bacon chips, caramelized red onion (method is above) mix together with a spatula until well combined.
- 7. Then add all your dressing ingredients and mix again. Top off with the leeks, cling wrap and refrigerate immediately.

Christmas Coconut Macaroons

Ingredients:

- 4 large egg whites
- 2/3 cup Hullets White sugar
- 3 tablespoons gin (optional)
- 11/2 teaspoons grated lime zest
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon almond extract
- I package (400grams) sweetened shredded coconut
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 8 ounces white baking chocolate, melted
- Cherries (green and red one would be colourful and nice)

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° C. Whisk the first six ingredients until blended. In another bowl, toss coconut with flour, stir in egg white mixture.
- 2. Drop by 2 full tablespoons in, onto the greased baking sheets. Bake until tops are light brown, 15-18 minutes. Remove from pans to wire racks to cool completely.
- 3. Dip the base of macaroons into melted white chocolate, allowing excess to drip off. Place on waxed paper, until set.
- 4. Dip the base of a cherry in white chocolate and place on the centre of each macaroon. (Some red some green cherries!). Store in an airtight container, and serve



INGREDIENTS:

125ml Orange juice 240ml sparkling water

2 teaspoon vanilla syrup

2 teaspoons grenadine

Orange slices for garnish

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Freeze all of the Orange juice in an ice tray
- 2. Crush a few ice cubes with the frozen orange juice and spoon into glass
- 3. Add sparkling Water
- 4. Slowly add in vanilla syrup
- 5. Slowly add in grenadine
- 6. Garnish with orange slice.

The **Zesty Zimunda** (Zimunda)


Recently, I was part of the Art Fest held at Wild Geese Lodge,

Speaking Through Imagery

When I was just starting out in photography in university, I was privileged to be around a lot of young artists. Although it seemed I had an eye for photography, my major was Marketing Research. So as a self taught photographer, I appreciated the proximity to "real artists" as a way to learn more aesthetic ways to shoot. During this time, one of my workmates and I had struck up a friendship. He was a brilliant digital artist, and I was always in awe when he would casually sketch up some mini-masterpiece on his iPad in the space of an hour lunch break. During one of his sketches I asked him why he hadn't held a gallery show showcasing his art. At this point I'd seen him draw hundreds of images. His answer was simple; "I don't have anything to say yet".

That phrase has stuck with me throughout my photography career. See, I thought I was just

making pretty things to look at. I thought that's what artists do. While I still take and put out images that are purely aesthetic, I've always been aware of the impact of imagery. So even when I started my company with my friend, we always obsessed over imagery, The use of colour in a movie, the emotions that different angles give to an image, the correct colour temperature to put on a wedding photo. I mean, we get REAL nerdy about it. There are probably hundreds of photos on your phone right now, you can easily devalue the impact of a photo. But all these images are pieces of history. A documentation of how we live in this place, in this time.

Left: **Guides to the hereafter** - a Haus of Stone project. We wanted to evoke a feeling of the surreal with these models, almost like the guides who usher your spirit to the next plane when you pass on.

Ode to Askana - another Haus of Stone story. Shoot done in Domboshava with one of my favorite clients, Haus of Stone. The whole shoot and fashion line was a meditation on women and their spiritual place in Zimbabwean culture.

That's informed how I work as a Zimbabwean Photographer, and I say "zimbabwean photographer" because I really take the title seriously. I have taken wedding photos, corporate photos of building projects, High fashion photos and street photography. But the underlying ethos of all my photos that I take for myself, is my "Zimbabweaness" (not a real word, I know, but indulge me). Sometimes there is a strong focus in the Zimbabwean photography scene to be "just as good" as our international partners, but in this pursuit we can try to erase Zimbabweanness from our visual pursuits. No shade intended, Lord knows I've had my phase of "international standard" photos. You know the

type. "It doesn't even look like it's in Zimbabwe". But it IS in Zimbabwe. Maybe it's an embarrassment of ourselves or our current situation? It would probably take a much longer article than this to break that down. But I'm now very clear on the philosophy behind my photos. I am declaring a Zimbabwean narrative. Not THE Zimbabwean narrative, but one of many. I am very proud to showcase every aspect of Zimbabwe. The bad does not define a country, neither does the good. Good, bad, ugly and beautiful Zimbabwe shines through in the photos I'm most proud of. And it seems the world is listening and responding. A few weeks ago, my words and my art were showcased in a BBC article about African Photographers changing the global African narrative. Seems I've found my "something to say".

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
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AND IN OTHER NEWS
